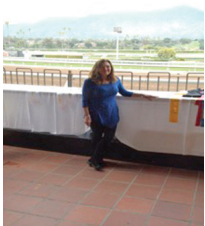

Gretchen Clark-Owner/Trainer
Showcase Training Stables, Redlands

Gretchen Clark has been training professionally for 40 years. Her specialty is hunters and jumpers. Gretchen grew up in Fresno and in her years as a junior rider won the Barbara Worth Medal and the California State Horseman's Association English title. After moving to Southern California, Gretchen became head instructor at Eaton Canyon in Pasadena. Shortly thereafter she began training horses and grew her business by winning many LA County and PCHA championships. She got a taste of the grand prix ring in the 1980s and that soon became her love. In 1985 she moved to Sunset Hills in Redlands as a trainer and manager of the 120-horse facility. In 1991, she and her husband Dennis purchased 17 acres off Live Oak Canyon Road in Redlands and built what is now Showcase Training Stables. Showcase riders compete at all levels in the Hunter/Jumper arena and have won many championships, medals and medal finals.

Gretchen also serves as the president of IEHJA and part of her responsibilities include co-managing the Fall Festival End of Year Horse Show held every November and organizing the annual Red Carpet awards Banquet in February. LoriLea and Don Franklin own and operate Willowbrook Riding Club and Equestrian Center. For the past 25 years, LoriLea has designed and run her “saddle series” horse shows at the Willowbrook facility. She has taught hundreds of young and adult students how to ride and compete in hunter/jumper and western competitions. LoriLea began her riding career at age 2 and competed successful as a junior rider. She began instructing as a teenager and has had her own barn since she and husband Don built Willowbrook.

LoriLea has spent her career molding young riders and horses. The four Franklin children are very successful competitors; they too started showing at a young age at the Willowbrook home shows. They have also competed in scores of outside shows including HITS Thermal. LoriLea has hosted 270 home hunter/jumper and western shows and has trained her students to ride in every show division from leadline to adult hunter/jumpers. She designs the course and classes and manages the shows in accordance with all sanctioning bodies including USHJA, IEHJA, GSDHJA, and OCHSA. Managing a training stable and being its chief instructor has been a rich and rewarding experience for LoriLea: she is gratified when her students compete and win but is just as proud of her riders who don't compete and ride for pleasure.
