Moreover, you may also reduce the cost of maintaining your horse farm by performing regular upkeep and practicing the fundamentals of prevention. For sure, maintaining a horse property requires you to invest both the time and money. If time is an issue, you can always hire somebody to help you.

Here are 10 ideas to improve your horse property:

1. Pasture management

Take time to learn how grazing affects your pasture to understand how you can improve it significantly. Rotational grazing is an excellent practice that allows pasture to rest and gives manure enough time to break down. Let the grass recover up to 10 cm to protect valuable topsoil. Use a recommended fertilization program to revive your exhausted pasture. You can considerably extend both the quality and quantity of your pasture using suitable fertilization.



2. Weed management

Getting rid of weed infestation from your horse property can be expensive, which is why prevention is advised by experts. It can be difficult to distinguish and identify weeds from another flowering plant. Spend some time to learn about invasive and poisonous weeds. Identify and eliminate them before they become a problem in your pasture.

Any over-grazed areas are prone to support weed growth, especially along the fence lines. Use weed sprays carefully and restrict horse access for some time.
